Gender-Based Violence Awareness and Prevention Participation Slip

Break the Box is a state-wide project that encourages youth to break free from harmful thinking that leads to violence. Students all over Texas are learning new ways to think about gender equality and will be gaining skills for healthier relationships. The local program began in 2015 and we are very excited to grow and expand with each new school year.

Students enrolled in the 6th to 8th grade at any school in the Concho Valley are eligible for our middle school program. Student enrolled in the 9th to 12th grade are eligible for our Phase 2 peer leader program and will serve as a mentor to students in the middle school program.

Your Teen has expressed interest in attending Break the Box Leadership Program sponsored by Open Arms Rape Crisis Center & LGBT+ Services. The youth attending this program will be given the opportunity to learn about how to make an impact in the local community. Youth who volunteer for this program are committing to participating from August 2017 to May 2018.

The program meets monthly with additional opportunities for community volunteer work and social events. Announcements for meetings times, dates, locations are posted on our agency Facebook page, Instagram and website. Unfortunately, our office staff is unable to transport youth, but people enrolled in the program can ride-share with other program participants.

Students will participate with other teens to collaborate efforts to raise awareness and education around this issue. Over a teens lifetime, it is likely that 1 in 3 of them will experience some type of abuse in a relationship.¹ Your Teen recognizes this to be a problem that is significant in their community. We applaud their level of maturity and commitment to be a part of this exciting program.
